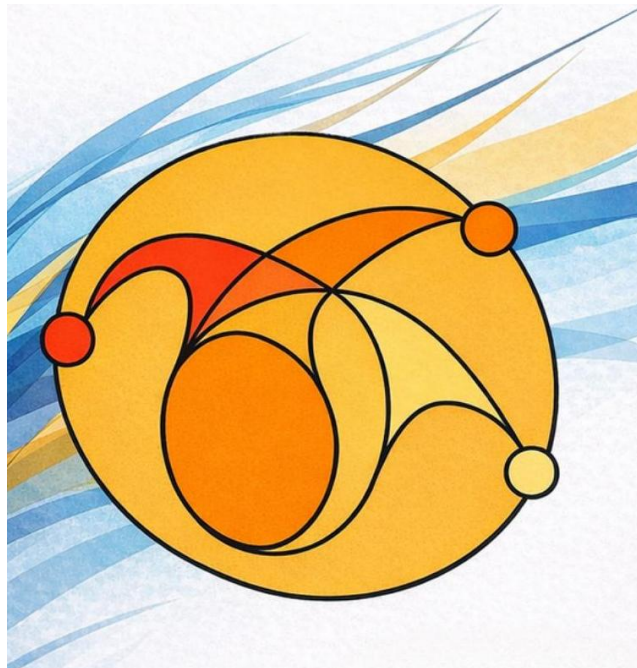

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What to Expect from Your PCW Practitioner

THE ASSOCIATION FOR PCW PRACTITIONERS

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PCW Practitioners are expected to adhere to the following standards and obligations in all their professional activities:

- ☐ Follow the PCW Code of Conduct.
- ☐ Follow their Duty of Candour.
- ☐ Uphold confidentiality and obtain appropriate consent.
- ☐ Maintain political neutrality in professional contexts.
- ☐ Raise concerns and whistleblow appropriately.
- ☐ Be indemnified for the whole scope of their work.
- ☐ Comply with the Prohibition of Conversion Therapy Policy.
- ☐ Comply with anti-modern slavery legislation.
- ☐ Have a complaints and grievance process in place.
- ☐ Provide contact details for relevant professional bodies and inform them of the outcomes of complaints where relevant.
- ☐ Comply with data protection legislation and online privacy obligations.
- ☐ Comply with advertising standards.
- ☐ Comply with the Association's Social Media Policy.

Each of the above expectations is supported by a corresponding policy document issued by the PCW Association Board. Practitioners are expected to familiarise themselves with each policy and adhere to its requirements as a condition of their membership.
